For the Maasai, a *Mkurugenzi Mtendaji* is a Project Manager-in-Chief. At 34 years of age, Kisioki is that leader, overseeing every aspect of ICSEE work.

Since starting out with the Project with only a secondary school education, Kisioki is now an expert in solar electric design and water sanitation.

He designed the Cow Fodder Factory and Cattle Feedlot and leads Maasai herders towards the new thinking needed as climate changes.

He organizes committed community members who multiply good leadership. Here are Kisioki's views on leadership:

A leader has to be good in many ways—not only one way.

A leader has to show the way to other people.

A leader has to be a creative problem-solver because there are always challenges.

A leader can always see a better way and knows how to get through.

A leader treats others well and knows how to work together with others.

A leader cooperates, involves others, and builds a strong team.

A leader has to inspire and create other leaders.


